

**Celebrated in Italy the final conference of the 2Fish Project entitled  
"The labour market in the fisheries sector: training experiences and strategies for  
sustainable development of the sector"**

It was held last April 3, at the Congress Palace of Bellaria, Italy, the final conference, which concluded its work and activities over the last 30 months of the 2Fish Project , funded by the European Union under the " Leonardo Da Vinci" and made by a representative partnership that covers the main European seas, where fishing is an important component of the local economy: the Mediterranean Sea, the Atlantic Ocean and the North Sea.

The partners of 2Fish, from northern Europe (the North Cape in Norway) and western (Galicia in Spain, Dublin, Ireland and Denmark Thyborøn ), have landed at Rimini for a series of meetings and visits with institutional representatives and cooperative world of fishing to participate then, finally, in the work of the Conference.

The conference, which was attended by leading representatives of the European Commission , the Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Forestry and the Emilia -Romagna region as well as national and European stakeholders, it was an opportunity to discuss and exchange views on policies and training for the employment in the fisheries sector but also in the entire seafood chain, on the different systems of education and training in the economies of the sea with an eye on European strategies put in place by the EU in 2014-2020.

The conference was an important opportunity to explore the theme of employment not only in the fisheries sector in the strict sense, the work on board fishing vessels at sea, but rather to highlight and enhance the role of all secondary service professions related to sector; essentially all those professionals that revolve around the primary production: managers and administrators, traders, clerks and accountants, restaurateurs, biologists, researchers, trainers, etc. .
